You get to...

- Network with a number of different companies and national laboratory representatives in a formal manner at the career fair as well as in an informal manner at dinners and socials.
- Meet other nukes from across the country and hear about the programs at their schools
- Discover all that University of Wisconsin-Madison has to offer
- Explore Madison, Wisconsin through the tours and socials hosted by the conference
- Educate yourself on a number of research projects students and labs are undertaking
- Participate in a number of workshops, panel sessions, and tours
- Learn about the American Nuclear Society on the national level and on the professional side

When Planning Your Trip:

- Coordinate flights and transportation to and from the airport.
- Book a hotel room with other attending GT ANS members
- Note that reimbursements are provided by the University of Wisconsin-Madison to help cover travel costs, and have typically covered around 70% of the costs.
- Do not book in a hotel outside of the conference hotel; you become ineligible for reimbursements among other inconveniences.
- Do not book the flight with your airline miles; you can't be reimbursed for miles, but you can be reimbursed for a flight ticket.
- Utilize the <u>Facebook group</u> to see what flights people are picking and who needs roommates!

^{**}Note: Registration is cheaper for national ANS members. Instead of paying \$75 for registration, pay \$35 for the conference after registering for a \$30 national membership. You get conference registration AND membership perks for less.
